Local Toys for Tots Campaign Coordinators conduct an array of activities throughout the year, which include golf tournaments, foot races, bicycle races and other purely voluntary events designed to increase interest in Toys for Tots, and concurrently generate toy and monetary donations.

Please bring an unwrapped toy to as many events and meetings as possible. We will be collecting toys in October, November & most of December. These toys do not have to be expensive. The children that will receive them will be tickled just to receive a gift.
